

Part Two Cut Throat Finch:

Diet & Feeding

As with all our treasured birds a quality finch seed mix incorporating canary seed, various millets and panicum is the minimum requirements of the cut-throat finch's seed diet. Be aware seed lacks many of the essential vitamins and minerals that our birds require to be healthy and productive. Vitamins and minerals must be compensated for by introducing other foods and tonics. Sprouting and soaked seed increases its nutritional value and is a cheap way to improve your bird's health and virility. Fresh green seed heads should also be offered as often as possible.

Leafy greens should be provided throughout the year. Kale, bok choy, endive and silver beet are easily purchased or grown and are very nutritious and will be readily eaten by most of our finch species. (I have found that if your finches do not readily accept the greens offered place a canary in the aviary to show them how to eat greens)

Be aware that if Spinach is offered to your birds it should be offered sparingly as it can contribute to calcium deficiency.

Live food is an important requirement to some of our cut throat finches diet and should be provided as required throughout the year — especially during the breeding season. Live food such as mealworms, maggots, termites, and small crickets will be consumed readily and can be purchased from Pet Produce Stores or bread at home. Soft finch food mixes can also be provided for an added nutrient boost, particularly when breeding from your local produce store/ pet shop or made at home.

Breeding

As with most finches bread in Australia the cut-throat finch breeds best in spring and autumn, As aviculturists we must endeavour and ensure that the breeding hen bird is at least 12 months of age.

In the wild, cut-throat finches often take over the nests from other birds. Because of this, many pairs will be poor nest builders who need a little assistance from humans. A handful of grass shaped into a ring and stuffed inside a nesting receptacle is enough to get them started. (Taken direct from the avian hub on the internet)

Many varieties of nests can be purchased and should be readily accepted by your cut throat finch. However they are reported to prefer a medium-sized cane nest that can be purchased readily. As with a few finch species they may not re-use a nest, so multiple nests and sites should be provided. Breeders have reported that cut-throat finches will tolerate nest inspections, but they should kept to a minimum and only as necessary.

Cut Throats typically will lay 3-5 eggs in each clutch, and incubation is shared by both parents for approximately 14 days. Fledging takes place at approximately three weeks of age and are usually independent three weeks later. If the birds are being bread again it is advisable that to remove the young birds from the aviary once they become independent

Sexing

Breeders state cut-throat finches are easy to visually sex once they have reached maturity. Only the males have the distinctive red band across the throat.

Mutations

Avicultural circles and breeders have reported that cut-throat finch mutations at this point in time are quite rare in . It has been reported that birds with yellow throats—instead of the usual red—pop up occasionally. Even more rare is a white (likely albino) mutation, which presents as a purely white bird with a red throat.


